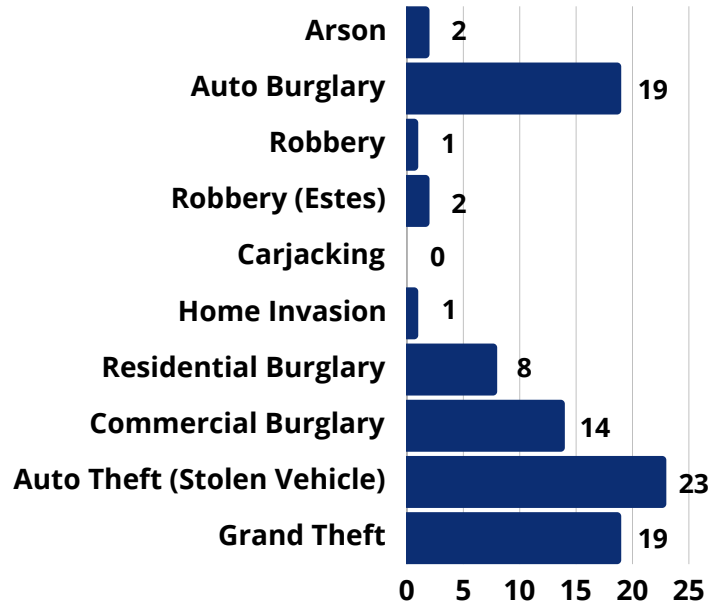

Arson

On 11/1, multiple parties reported a bush on fire in the area of Fremont Blvd and I-880, near a residence on Deep Creek Road. One reporting party saw a subject walking away from the fire as it was growing and believed the subject may have caused it. Officers arrived on scene with Fremont Fire Department and located two palm trees and a utility pole on fire. A live power line had fallen and blocked several lanes of traffic. FFD extinguished the fire. Officers located the subject nearby and found a lighter and matches in his possession. Officers arrested the subject. #241101021

On 11/4, officers responded to a thrift store on Robin St regarding a subject setting a dumpster on fire. The reporting party saw the subject ignite the fire and flee on a bicycle. Officers arrived and extinguished the fire. No damage to structures was observed. #241104041

Assault with a Deadly Weapon

On 10/31, officers responded to assist the SRO at a high school on Seneca Park Ave regarding a student (subject) who had attempted to stab another student with a knife. Officers safely disarmed and detained the subject and then arrested her. #241031016

Home Invasion

On 10/31, officers responded to an in-progress home invasion at a residence on Cochise Ct. Four subjects had entered the victim's home and held a shotgun to him as they robbed him and his wife. The subjects fled in a vehicle. Officers located the vehicle leaving the area and initiated a pursuit. The subjects were discarding items from the vehicle as the pursuit continued, including what was believed to be a handgun. The pursuit was eventually terminated in a nearby city. This case remains under investigation. #241031001

Possession of a Stolen Vehicle

On 10/29, officers responded to a residence on Pilgrim Loop regarding a report of four subjects wearing masks and looking into vehicles with flashlights. The subjects left in two vehicles, which officers located at Mission Blvd and Stanford Ave. When officers attempted to stop them, the vehicles fled. One vehicle was eventually stopped, and the two juvenile subjects inside were detained without incident. Multiple stolen license plates were found inside the vehicle. Officers cited both subjects and released them to a family member. #241029001

Shots Fired

On 11/2, officers responded to a call regarding shots fired at an apartment complex on Rancho Arroyo Pkwy. The reporting party said a neighbor fired multiple rounds in a nearby apartment. A woman and three children exited the apartment shortly afterward and fled in a vehicle. Officers contacted the woman and discovered that her husband (subject) had fired multiple rounds into a patio planter box during an argument. Officers evacuated neighboring residents and initiated a callout. The subject refused to cooperate. Additional officers, including the department's negotiation team (HNT), were called to the scene. After several hours, the subject exited and surrendered outside the apartment, where officers arrested him. A search of the apartment yielded two handguns, ammunition, and multiple spent shell casings. #241102023

On 11/2, officers responded to an apartment complex on Central Ave after a mother reported that her adult son (subject) had been shot. Officers responded and determined that the subject had accidentally shot himself in the leg while handling his loaded firearm. Officers rendered medical aid, and the subject was transported to a hospital with a non-life-threatening gunshot wound. #241102024

Suspicious Circumstances

On 11/4, Dispatch received a call from a reporting party who advised she was being held against her will at a residence on Fitzsimmons Common. Officers responded and conducted a welfare check inside the residence, but the reporting party could not be located. There was evidence that the area was being used as a brothel. This case remains under investigation. #241104030
