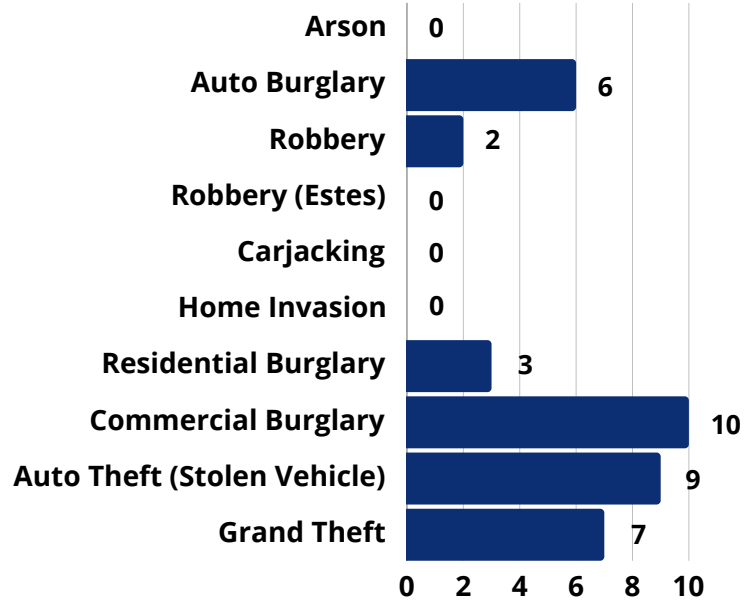

Assault with a Deadly Weapon

On 12/3, officers responded to a report of an assault with a deadly weapon near Paseo Padre Pkwy and Ardenwood Blvd. The victim was involved in a road rage incident with another driver (subject). The subject exited the vehicle with a knife and swung it at the victim but did not make contact. The subject also battered the victim and fled in a vehicle. #241203011

Robbery

On 12/3, officers responded to a robbery on Gifford St. The victim was approached by two subjects in a vehicle, who gestured for her to come over to the vehicle. The subjects removed the victim's gold necklace and bracelets, pushed the victim, and then fled in a vehicle. #241203019

Suspicious Circumstance

On 12/4, an officer responded to a report of a suspicious circumstance at an apartment complex on Civic Center Dr. Two subjects living in the complex were seen stealing packages and a large quantity of mail from a community mailbox. Investigation revealed that the apartment where the subjects were staying may have been fraudulently rented. This case remains under investigation. #241204019

Outside Assist

On 12/4, officers responded to a nearby city to assist detectives with a search for firearms inside the subject's residence. K9 Nala located a rifle and handgun hidden inside the residence. #241204011

Disaster Evacuation

On 12/5, FPD received notification from the Fremont Office of Emergency Services regarding a possible tsunami stemming from an offshore earthquake in northern California. Due to the potential danger, public evacuations were organized. Command team members began communicating with Fremont Unified School District and identifying other emergency operational needs. The alert was later canceled, the evacuation order was rescinded, and the tsunami did not materialize. #P24142063

Bomb Threat

On 12/6, several school districts throughout the Bay Area received a bomb threat via email. School Resource Officers and patrol officers worked with Fremont Unified School District personnel to ensure students were safe. No suspicious packages were located, and there was no evidence found to support the presence of explosive devices in any Fremont schools. #241206006 and #241206007.

Prowling

On 12/5, officers responded to a residence on Gillett Rd regarding a subject who was banging on the front door and demanding to speak with someone who did not live there. The subject then entered the backyard of the home through an unlocked side gate and yelled for several minutes before fleeing on a bicycle. Investigation revealed that the subject was a well-known repeat offender with multiple prior arrests. The subject is currently on probation for a previous crime. Officers contacted the subject's probation officer.

Stolen Vehicle

On 12/7, officers located a stolen vehicle near Niles Community Park. The vehicle fled at a high rate of speed, and no pursuit was initiated. California Highway Patrol assisted in updating the vehicle's location via an air unit. For the next hour, the vehicle drove erratically through Fremont and other cities on I-880 north and south, with speeds ranging from 20 mph to 130 mph. Eventually, the vehicle exited the freeway into a nearby city, and five subjects fled on foot. Multiple agencies, including the Fremont Police Department, Newark Police Department, Milpitas Police Department, and California Highway Patrol, worked together to take all five juvenile subjects into custody. The stolen vehicle was located and recovered. #241207001

Trespassing

On 12/9, officers responded to a report of trespassing at a commercial space on Landing Pkwy. The reporting party said someone may be living inside the building. Officers detained one subject inside the building. The subject said he noticed the door was open and went inside to sleep. Officers transported the subject to the FPD jail and issued a notice to appear. #241209004
