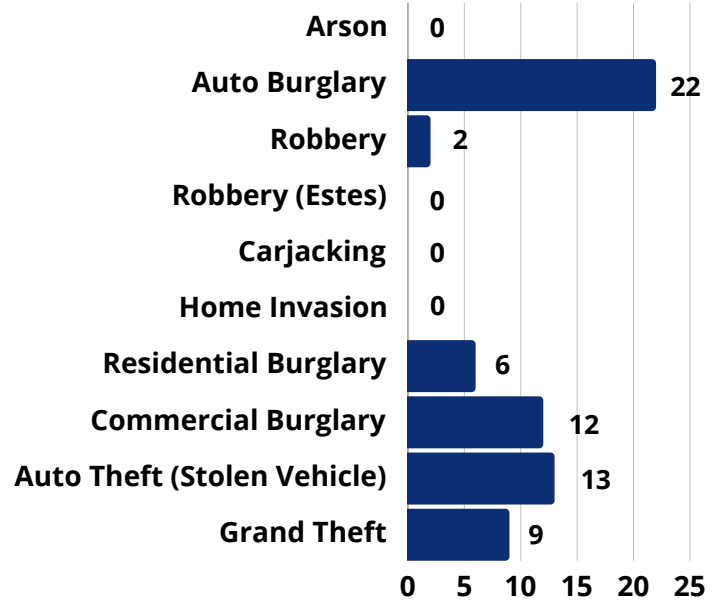




# Fremont Police Week In Review

## Commercial Burglary

On 12/10, a security guard at a commercial building on Fremont Blvd observed two subjects jump the fence into the building. The two used bolt cutters to enter the building and began stripping copper wire from the electrical room. Officers responded and saw the subjects fleeing across Fremont Blvd. Officers found one subject behind a building and the other behind a trash can. Both subjects were arrested. #241210003

## Fraud/Identity Theft

On 12/10, officers followed up on a fraud investigation at an apartment on Civic Center Dr. The apartment had been rented fraudulently using a stolen identity. As officers were searching the apartment, two subjects attempted to open the front door. The officers inside opened the door, and the subjects fled on foot. After a brief foot pursuit, both subjects were detained. Both subjects had active warrants, and officers arrested them. A search of the apartment revealed identity theft items for more than ten victims, as well as stolen property from a commercial burglary in a nearby city. #241204019

On 12/11, an officer stopped a suspicious vehicle with mismatched plates as it rolled through a gas station on Auto Mall Pkwy and S Grimmer Blvd. The driver (subject) was found to have a suspended driver's license, and the vehicle had fraudulent license plates. Officers arrested the subject, and the vehicle was towed. A search of the vehicle revealed electronic card readers, blank credit cards, and other items consistent with fraud activity. #241211030

## Grand Theft

On 12/11, five masked subjects stormed into a sports supply store on Pacific Commons Blvd and fled with \$15,000 worth of merchandise. The subjects fled the area in a vehicle. This case remains under investigation. #241211032

## Outside Assist

On 12/11, officers received information that an outside agency was conducting surveillance on subjects suspected of armed robbery. Specifically, these offenders would follow victims home after watching them withdraw cash from the ATM. The outside agency was actively surveilling the suspects as they cased multiple bank parking lots on Paseo Padre Pkwy. Specialized units from FPD, including Major Crimes Task Force (MCTF), General Property Crimes (GEN) and Crime Reduction Unit (CRU), developed a plan to contact the individuals who were backed into a parking space in direct view of ATMs and patrons. A vehicle containment technique was initiated and the occupants within the suspect vehicle briefly attempted to elude capture by attempting to ram unmarked police vehicles. Officers deployed less lethal projectiles which led to the suspects complying with police commands. Four suspects were detained. One had an active felony warrant for a felon in possession of a firearm. All were charged with attempt robbery. A search of the vehicle yielded two loaded firearms with one having a high capacity magazine. #241211026

## Residential Burglary

On 12/15, a reporting party and his wife were in their residence on Belmont Ter when they discovered a shattered side window and muddy footprints leading upstairs. The victims barricaded themselves downstairs as they waited for officers to arrive. Officers cleared the residence but did not find any subjects. The same day, another reporting party who lives on the same street returned home to find their rear sliding door shattered, and the house ransacked. Muddy footprints were also found throughout this residence, and the victims reported a loss of several thousands of dollars in designer clothing, bags, and jewelry. ## Suspicious Circumstances Fire

On 12/12, officers responded to a department store at the Fremont Hub regarding a vehicle on fire in the parking lot. Witnesses said a subject was running from the vehicle shortly after the fire started. Officers located the registered owner of the vehicle nearby. The subject who ran away was not located but is not believed to be a suspect, and it is suspected that the fire was accidental. #241212016

## Trespassing

On 12/14, officers responded to a café on Mowry Ave regarding a subject causing a disturbance. The subject exposed himself in the store and threw coffee on the ground. He also yelled racial slurs at customers. Officers arrived and arrested the subject. #241214008
