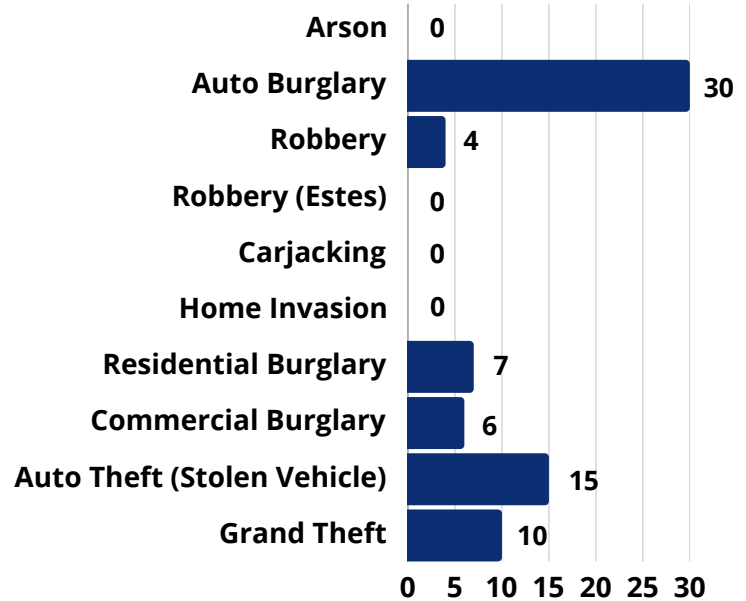




# Fremont Police Week In Review

## Fraud/Grand Theft

On 1/2, FPD's General Property Crimes (GEN), Crime Reduction Unit (CRU), and Major Crimes Task Force (MCTF) assisted the FBI in surveillance of several banks in Fremont. The investigation focused on known suspects who were involved in EBT scamming and card skimming. FPD detectives arrested five suspects on felony charges and recovered approximately \$71,000, which is believed to be the theft from just one morning. #250102004, #250102005, and #250102006

## Hit and Run

On 12/31, Dispatch received a call regarding a hit-and-run collision on Victoria Ave. The subject crashed into a parked car and fled on foot. A neighbor chased the subject down and made him return to the scene. Officers determined the subject was under the influence and arrested him. #241231020

## Public Intoxication

On 1/2, officers responded to a convenience store on Mission Blvd and Niles Ave regarding a report of a subject beating a dog with a stick. Officers encountered a subject who was highly intoxicated and stumbling into traffic. The subject also had several outstanding misdemeanor warrants. The subject actively resisted officers as they attempted to detain him. Due to his level of intoxication, the subject was taken to a local hospital. The dog was taken to the Tri-City Animal Shelter. #250102003

## Residential Burglary

On 1/4, officers responded to a residential burglary report on White Birch Ter. The victims returned from a trip to find the rear sliding door had been broken into and a safe containing more than \$100,000 worth of jewelry was stolen. #250104002

On 1/5, officers responded to a residential burglary report on Cabrillo Dr. The rear door was shattered, and the residence was ransacked. More than \$10,000 worth of silver and electronics were stolen. #250105018

## Robbery

On 1/2, an elderly victim reported that she had been robbed at a bank on Fremont Blvd. The victim had withdrawn cash from the ATM and was walking back to her vehicle when a suspect grabbed her purse from her shoulder. The suspect was holding a semi-automatic firearm. He took the purse and fled in a vehicle that another suspect was driving. Shortly afterward, another law enforcement agency stopped the vehicle in their jurisdiction for a robbery committed in another city. The suspects were found attempting to light the victim's purse and wallet on fire. FPD officers recovered the victim's property and returned it to her.

On 1/3, a victim withdrew money from an ATM at a bank on Warm Springs Blvd. Three subjects armed with pistols approached and robbed the victim at gunpoint, then fled in a vehicle. While officers were on scene, another robbery occurred on Onondaga Wy, in which three subjects with firearms robbed four victims of their belongings outside their residence. Twenty minutes later, another robbery occurred in a nearby city. The subjects' vehicle was not located. #250103003 and #250103004

## Suspicious Circumstances

On 1/6, officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances on Easterday Way. A teenage juvenile was walking her dog when a delivery driver (subject) began to follow her in his vehicle. The subject touched the juvenile's hand and attempted to speak with her, even after learning she was a minor. The juvenile ran home and told her parents, who contacted the delivery company to identify the subject. Officers are following up with the subject. #250106031

## Vandalism

On 1/3, officers conducted a security check of an encampment near Paseo Padre Pkwy and Washington Blvd. Officers contacted a subject at the encampment who had set up an unauthorized structure and was stealing power from a city utility box. Officers arrested the subject. #250101015

## Warrant Service

On 1/2, officers responded to an apartment complex on Bay St regarding reports of a subject screaming and banging on tenants' doors. Officers contacted the subject, finding him highly intoxicated. The subject also had multiple outstanding felony warrants. Officers arrested the subject. #250102001
