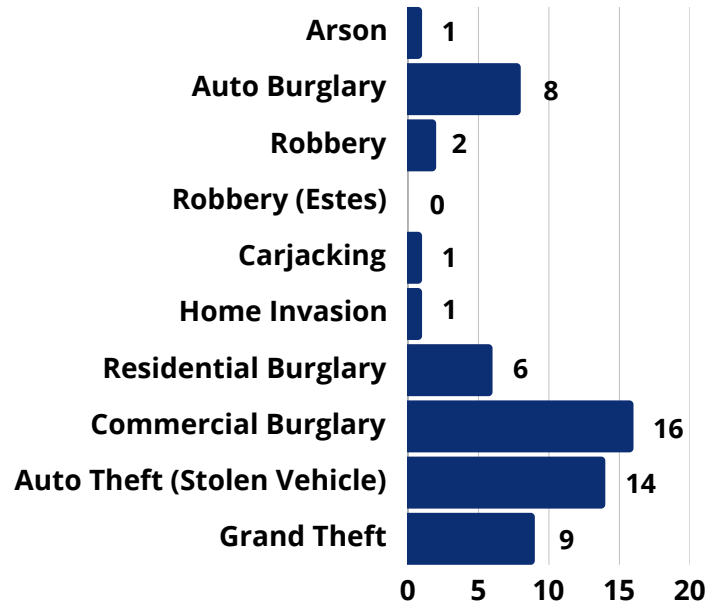

Assault with a Deadly Weapon

On 1/9, officers responded to a report of an assault with a deadly weapon at a fast-food restaurant on Grimmer Blvd. The victim said an unknown subject had walked by her, put a cup in front of her, and then struck her on the head with a hammer. The victim feared for her safety and fled. #250109007

Attempted Carjacking and Resisting Arrest

On 1/10, officers responded to a report of a subject who was screaming outside a business on Christy St. The subject refused to comply with officers' requests and continued to yell and make incoherent statements. She walked into traffic, preventing vehicles from moving freely. A garbage truck stopped in front of the subject, and she attempted to open the door and steal the vehicle. Officers arrested the subject. #250110021

Commercial Burglary

On 1/9, a manager at a business on Kearney St reported an attempted commercial burglary. The door was scratched, and it appeared that a subject used a fire extinguisher to strike the door handle. This case remains under investigation. #250109020

Home Invasion

On 1/9, officers responded to a home invasion robbery on Gaucho Way. The victim was in the bathroom when the power to the home was turned off. She went downstairs and found a subject holding a screwdriver. The subject pushed the victim to the ground, stole her purse, then fled in a vehicle driven by another subject. The investigation revealed that the first subject had pretended to be a landscaper working on the victim's house. He entered through the sideyard, turned off the power, and entered the home to commit the robbery. This case remains under investigation. #250109026

Indecent Exposure

On 1/13, officers responded to a report of a subject who exposed himself to a victim near Stenhammer Dr. The victim was gardening in her front yard when the subject walked toward her and exposed himself. The subject continued walking, but officers located him nearby and arrested him. #250113037

Evading Arrest

On 1/11, an officer observed a vehicle driving erratically near Paseo Padre Pkwy and Isherwood Pl. The officer attempted a traffic stop, but the vehicle sped away, and the officer disengaged. The vehicle was located later, appearing to have crashed near Decoto Rd and Paseo Padre Pkwy. Officers saw a struggle in the front seat before the driver (subject) fled on foot and jumped a fence into a residential area. A victim in the vehicle said the subject was her boyfriend, and he had prevented her from leaving the vehicle. Officers set up a perimeter and K9 Aldo located the subject hiding in the shed of a residence. Officers arrested the subject. #250111004

Trespassing

On 1/12, a resident on Siward Dr reported possible squatting activity at his neighbor's unoccupied home. The homeowner was living out of state and told officers no one had permission to be on the property. Upon clearing the house, officers found numerous items that did not belong to the homeowner. The house was also strewn with garbage, feces, urine, and clothing. Officers found two subjects hiding in the attic and arrested them. #250112022

Unlawful Fire

On 1/10, officers responded to a report of arson near Hansen Ave and St. James St. The reporting party saw a subject start a fire near the railroad tracks and flee through a fence. Officers arrived to find the subject sitting on the sidewalk nearby and arrested him. The subject said he had intentionally set two fires that day. Both fires were safely extinguished. #250110012

Vandalism

In the early morning of 1/10, officers responded to a business on Lakeview Ct regarding an audible alarm. Surveillance footage revealed that three subjects had used a minivan to ram into the roll-up doors of the building. However, the alarm system deterred them from fully entering the building. Officers cleared the building and determined no entry was made. #250110001
