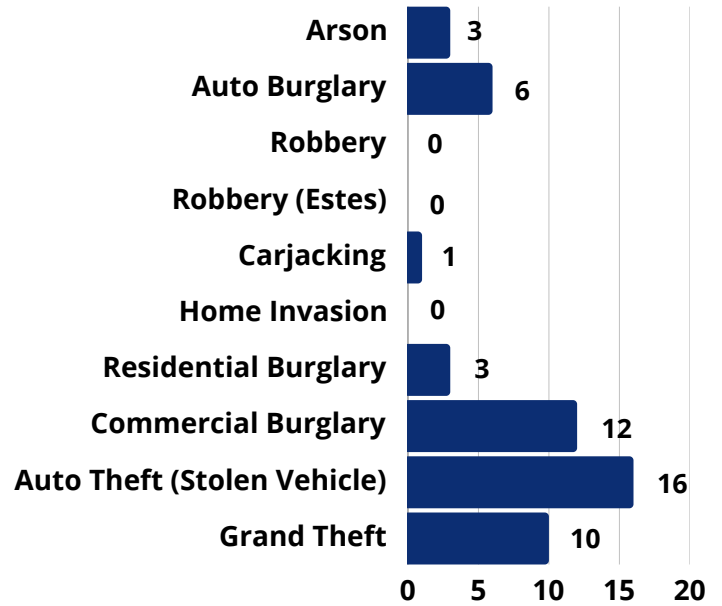

Animal Cruelty

On 2/25, officers responded to a fast-food restaurant on Ardenwood Blvd for an animal cruelty incident. The victim said she was under the overpass nearby when her neighbor (subject) stabbed her dog with a metal spike. Officers located the dog and transported it to a veterinary hospital for medical treatment. The next day, officers found the subject at an encampment and arrested him. #250225026

Armed Robbery

On 2/26, officers responded to a late reported armed robbery at a residence on Bogalusa Ct. The victim was repossessing a vehicle in the driveway when a subject exited the residence with a firearm. The subject pointed it at the victim and threatened to shoot him. He ordered the victim to remove the vehicle from the tow truck and leave the area. The victim off-loaded the vehicle and fled to call 911. The matter was forwarded to our Investigations Team, who located the subject and subsequently arrested him. #250226001

Arson

On 2/28, officers responded to a suspicious fire at an auto shop on Centralmont Pl. A neighbor reported seeing an awning on the building on fire. Officers arrived and extinguished the fire before it spread to the rest of the building. It is unclear how the fire started. #250228001

Assault with a Deadly Weapon

On 2/28, officers followed up on a late report of an assault with a deadly weapon near Stevenson Blvd and Davis St. A victim on a motorcycle and a subject in a vehicle were engaged in a road rage incident in which both parties were yelling at one another and aggressively cutting each other off. The subject brake-checked the victim so hard that the victim collided with the back of the vehicle and fell off his motorcycle. The subject fled in his vehicle. The next day, officers identified the subject and contacted him in an apartment on Monroe Ave. The subject was arrested. #250228017

Brandishing a Weapon

On 3/3, officers responded to a department store on Osgood Rd regarding a disturbance. A subject was in a physical altercation with the store's security guard after being told he could not purchase alcohol. The security guard asked the subject to leave, and the subject returned shortly afterward, brandishing a small hatchet. The security guard drew his firearm and detained the subject until officers arrived. The subject made statements of self-harm, and officers placed him on a mental health hold. #250303026 and #250303027

Fraud

On 3/3, a victim reported an incident of fraud in which a subject called her and claimed to be an officer with the Federal Trade Commission. The subject claimed that the victim's identity had been stolen and directed her to send all her money to the subject for safekeeping. Over several months, the victim withdrew approximately \$850,000 from her bank accounts and gave it to the subject. #250303006

Miscellaneous Public Service

On 2/28, officers responded to a swatting call at a residence on Lake Superior Pl. Dispatch received several calls from a reporting party who claimed he had used a firearm to shoot his family. Officers surrounded the residence and initiated a callout. A resident and several young juveniles exited, and officers quickly determined that the initial claims were unfounded. #250228022

Warrant Service

On 2/25, officers received a request for assistance from a detective at a sheriff's office in another state. The detective was following up on an investigation regarding two subjects who had committed several sex crimes at a college in their jurisdiction. One subject had recently enrolled in a college in Fremont, and FPD officers conducted surveillance to discover that the subject was living in an apartment on Stevenson Common. FPD officers responded to the apartment and arrested the subject. #250227021

On 3/1, officers responded to a call regarding two subjects who were aggressively panhandling in the parking lot at a grocery store on Argonaut Way. The subjects were targeting elderly customers, and one reporting party said the subjects had attempted to take her bag. Upon contact, officers discovered that one subject had an outstanding felony warrant. The subject was arrested. #250301006
