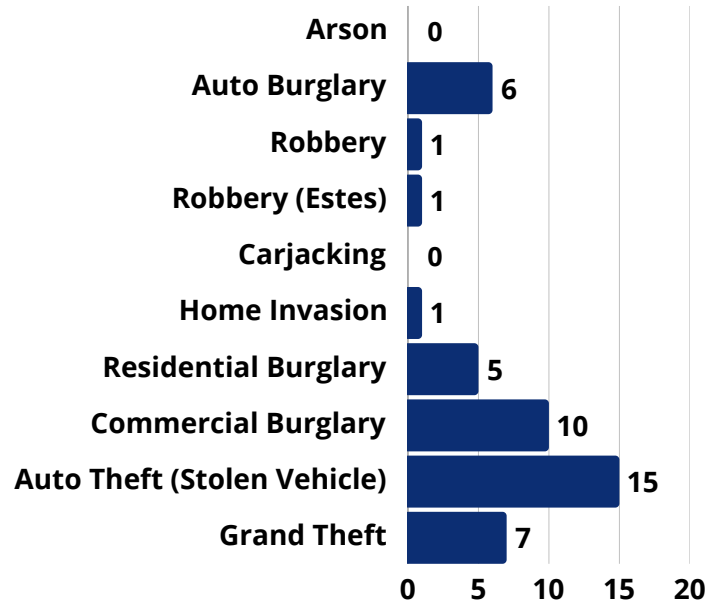

Commercial Burglary

On 4/8, officers responded to a commercial alarm at a liquor store on the 3900 block of Decoto Rd. Officers determined the glass was broken, but no entry was made. Shortly afterward, dispatch received a report of a shattered front door at a liquor store on the 34100 block of Fremont Blvd. The subjects entered, stole alcohol, and fled before officers arrived. Officers responded and determined that two other nearby businesses had been burglarized around the same time. #250408004, #250408005, and #250408006

Drunk in Public

On 4/9, officers responded to an elementary school on the 38400 block of Fremont Blvd. An intoxicated parent (subject) came to pick up his children. Instead, he urinated in the bushes, threw objects at the building, and cursed at staff. Officers arrested the subject, and the children's mother picked them up. #250409032

Forgery

On 4/14, a bank on the 3900 block of Decoto Rd reported that a subject was attempting to pass fraudulent checks. The subject opened multiple bank accounts in his own name and wrote checks to himself that were returned for insufficient funds. The subject wrote \$17,000 in returned checks and had accessed \$3,000 from the bank before the checks were returned. Officers responded and arrested the subject. #250414010

Grand Theft

On 4/8, a delivery driver reported a pallet theft at a business on the 47600 block of Kato Rd. The driver briefly left his truck to go inside a nearby building. While the truck was unattended, four subjects parked behind it and stole the shipment. The pallet contained approximately \$100,000 worth of computer chips. #250408017

Hit and Run Collision

On 4/14, officers responded to a collision on El Rey Ave and Bonito Dr regarding a hit and run collision. A subject vehicle was doing donuts and crashed into two parked vehicles. The subject drove a short distance away, and officers located him nearby. The subject was placed under arrest. #250414022

Home Invasion

On 4/14, officers responded to a home invasion at a residence on Ohna Ct. The victim arrived home from work and was walking into the garage when a subject demanded money from her. Another subject joined them, and both subjects ransacked the master bedroom. The subjects went back to the garage and took the victim's phone and approximately \$10,000 in cash. The subjects fled on foot. #250414034

Mental Health Hold

On 4/8 and 4/9, officers responded multiple times to a disturbance at an apartment on the 41100 block of Fremont Blvd. The resident (subject) barricaded himself, shattered the windows, and was throwing garbage from the fourth floor. In the early morning on 4/9, officers responded to a report of the smell of smoke coming from the residence. Officers forced entry into the apartment for public safety, finding a suitcase on fire in the bathtub. Officers extinguished the fire, and the subject was placed on a mental health hold. #250409002

Organized Retail Theft

On 4/12, officers responded to an in-progress theft at a drugstore on the 2600 block of Mowry Ave. Multiple subjects filled large bags with store merchandise, then fled in a vehicle. Officers located the subject vehicle nearby and conducted a traffic stop, finding the stolen items inside. Officers arrested four subjects, including three subjects with outstanding warrants. #250412027

The victim paid the subject more than \$15,000, but the subject stopped responding to him. #250414009
