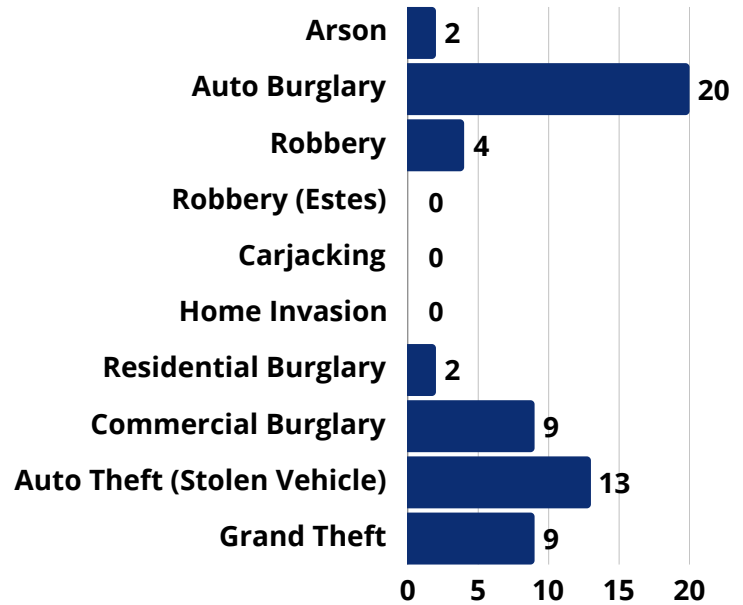

Arson

On 5/16, officers responded to a report of auto burglary on the 43400 block of Osgood Rd. A witness saw a subject breaking into the victim's vehicle and chased the subject away. The subject smashed the passenger window with a hammer and rummaged through the vehicle. The subject also poured what appeared to be lighter fluid on the vehicle's seats and lit something on fire inside it, causing minimal damage. #250516024

Battery

On 5/15, officers responded to an assault at Carriage Circle and Central Ave. The victim had arranged a meeting to sell items to a buyer who contacted her via social media. When the victim arrived, three subjects attacked her, including one subject who struck the victim with a metal cup. Officers promptly arrived and separated all involved parties. Investigation revealed that the subjects had used a fake account to lure the victim to meet them, and the altercation was due to an ongoing dispute between the victim and one of the subjects over a mutual ex-boyfriend. The three subjects were placed under arrest. #250515030

Fraud

On 5/16, officers investigated a late-reported cryptocurrency scam. The victim had received a text from unknown subjects pretending to be employees of a cryptocurrency platform. The subjects convinced the victim that his account was compromised. The subjects helped the victim create a new account and transfer \$70,000 from his original account to the new account. When the victim checked the new account, he found the money had been transferred out of the account. #250516006

Grand Theft

On 5/15, a victim reported grand theft at a bank on the 46700 block of Mission Blvd. He withdrew \$7,000 in cash and placed it in his vehicle. The victim was distracted by a subject outside the bank, and another subject was lingering near his vehicle. On his way home, the victim realized the cash was missing from the vehicle. #250515004

Kidnapping

On 5/19, a victim called Dispatch several times and disconnected, crying and asking for help. During an argument, the victim's boyfriend (subject) punched her. When the victim pulled into a parking lot and attempted to ask for help, the subject forcefully took her car keys. The victim texted updates to an officer, noting that she was in a vehicle with her boyfriend (subject), who would not let her leave the vehicle or call the police. The vehicle traveled to a nearby city, where officers in that city located the vehicle and detained the subject. The subject was placed under arrest. #250519008

Possession for Sale of Counterfeit Goods

On 5/18, officers responded to a possible fire in the parking lot of a hardware store on Ice House Ter. Upon arrival, officers found the fire had been stomped out. However, they contacted a subject with a fraudulent license plate and two pillowcases full of counterfeit electronics and jewelry. The subject was placed under arrest. #250518010

Suicide

On 5/13, Fremont Fire Department extinguished a vehicle that was fully engulfed in flames near the 7200 block of Stevenson Blvd. The vehicle appeared to have rammed several cattle gates and was parked in a field next to the railroad tracks. Officers located human remains inside the vehicle. The Alameda County Sheriff's Office Coroner's Office responded to take custody of the decedent. #250513039

Unlawful Fire

On 5/15, officers responded to a fire on the 44900 block of S Grimmer Blvd. A reporting party contacted two subjects near the railroad tracks, then saw a fire in the same area. Fremont Fire Department extinguished the fire before officers arrived. Officers located a tent that had been burned down, but there were no injuries as a result of the fire. #250515012

Vandalism

On 5/16, officers responded to a disturbance at a department store on the 39200 block of Fremont Blvd. A subject yelled at employees, demanded they purchase alcohol for her, and attempted to break the entrance doors with a traffic cone. The subject was also kicking vehicles in the parking lot, damaging at least one vehicle. The subject was placed under arrest. #250516002
