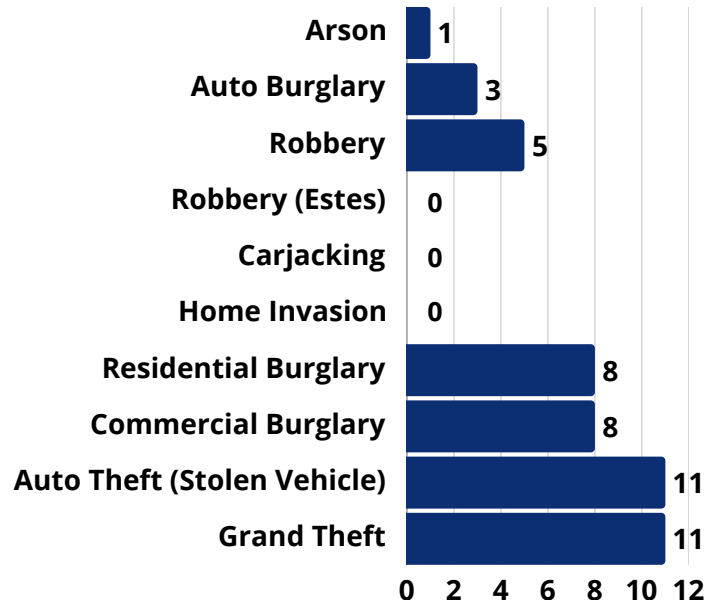




Fremont Police Week In Review

Arson

On 6/6, an officer responded to a dumpster fire on Bluebird Loop. The reporting party saw a subject adding items to the fire. When the officer arrived, they observed a second fire at a nearby park, in a trash can. Fremont Fire Department had already responded to the first fire and the officer extinguished the second fire. The officer used recordings to identify the subject and authored a warrant for his arrest. A nearby police department arrested the subject for the warrant. #250606006

Assault with a Deadly Weapon

On 6/4, officers responded to multiple calls regarding an assault at a liquor store on the 36300 block of Fremont Blvd. A subject left the store after being told he did not have enough money to pay for his items. The subject returned with a wooden branch and swung it toward the clerk (victim), breaking the cash register. Another victim who worked at a different store reported that the same subject had used his jacket to hit him. The subject fled on foot but was located nearby, yelling incoherently. He was initially combative, but officers detained the subject and placed him under arrest. #250604008

Indecent Exposure

On 6/8, officers responded to a grocery store on the 34400 block of Fremont Blvd regarding a subject chasing juveniles in the parking lot. Several victims in the area, including both adults and juveniles, said the subject was completely nude. The subject resisted officers but was eventually detained. The subject also had an outstanding felony warrant. The subject was placed under arrest. #250608011

Mental Health Hold

On 6/5, a maintenance worker was conducting street work near Bay St and Papazian Way when a subject ran by in the nude. The subject ran through the hot asphalt and into lanes of traffic nearby. When officers arrived, he appeared disoriented and spoke nonsensically. The subject was placed on a mental health hold. #250605004

Residential Burglary

On 6/7, officers responded to a residential burglary on Alamo Terrace. The victims woke to find their garage door broken and their two vehicles stolen. Several items were stolen from inside the house, as well as the victims' debit and credit cards. One of the stolen vehicles was located elsewhere in Fremont and the other was seen in a nearby city. #250607016

Robbery

On 6/3, a delivery driver was robbed at gunpoint while parked on Christy St. Five subjects in a van parked behind the delivery driver's truck and loaded two pallets of computer chips from the truck to the van. The loss was worth approximately \$190,000. When the driver attempted to intervene, the subjects confronted him and one subject reached for his waistband. Believing the subject had a firearm, the driver retreated. The subjects fled in multiple vehicles before officers arrived. Later the same day, another law enforcement agency stopped the van and another associated vehicle. The five subjects were placed under arrest and the loss was recovered in full. #250603018

Suspicious Circumstances Fire

On 6/9, officers responded to provide traffic control for a fire at a residence on Via Sombrio. Fremont Fire Department was fighting the fire and advised officers that the three vehicles parked in the driveway appeared to have been egged. This case is pending investigation to determine the cause of the fire. #250609003

Warrant Arrest

On 6/8, an officer responded to a report of a disturbance at a warehouse store on Pacific Commons Blvd. The reporting party said the subject was crawling near the gas pumps and when officers arrived, the subject was swinging a stick erratically. The subject had multiple outstanding warrants and was placed under arrest. #250608003
