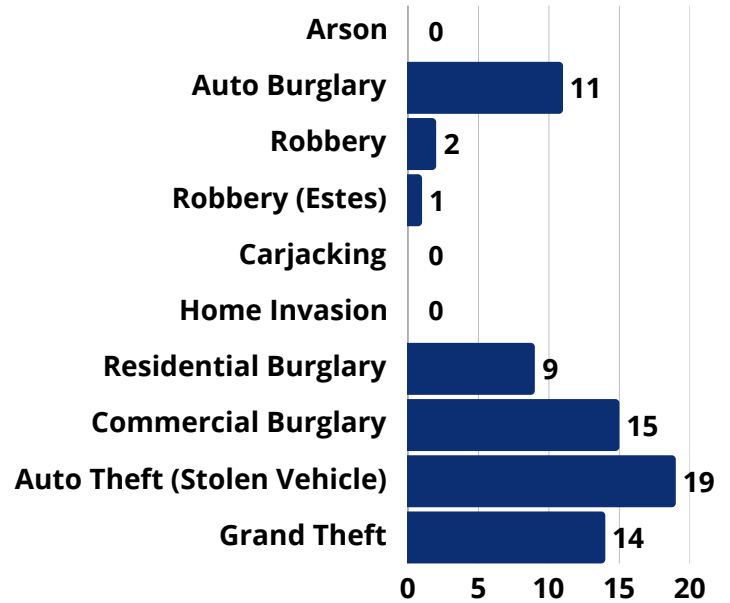

## Mental Health Hold

On 9/18, officers responded to a disturbance near Fremont Blvd and Irvington Blvd. A subject was walking through traffic and holding what appeared to be a firearm to her head. Upon contact, the subject could not answer the officers' questions and demonstrated signs of being under the influence. Officers also found human feces in the subject's pocket. The subject was placed on a mental health hold. The firearm was determined to be a cigarette holder that resembled a handgun. #250918032

Upon arrival, officers found a passenger in the vehicle, who said the driver (subject) had run out of gas. The subject was found to have an outstanding warrant.
