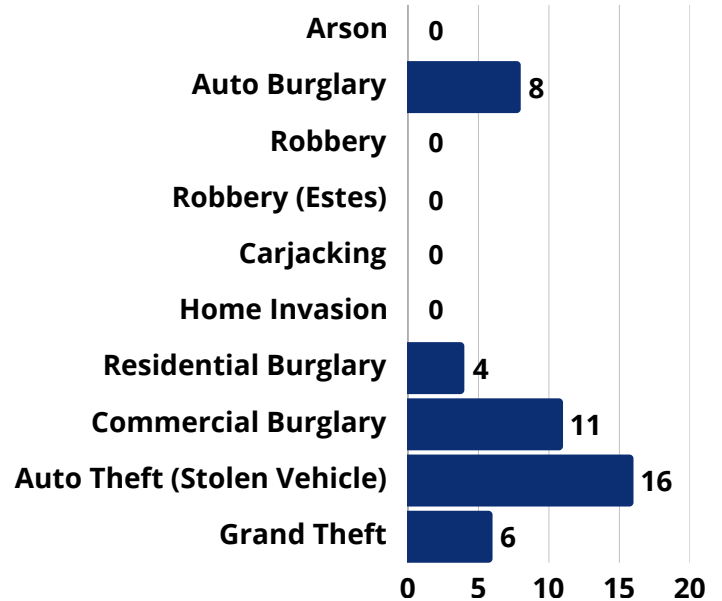

Commercial Burglary

On 9/23, officers responded to a commercial burglary at a smoke shop on Gable Dr. Six subjects used a vehicle to ram into the front of the shop, then entered the building to remove items. This case remains under investigation. #250923002

On 9/28, officers responded to a commercial burglary at a smoke shop on Gable Dr. Multiple subjects are believed to have entered the business by damaging the front window with a crowbar. The subjects fled before officers arrived. A preliminary investigation revealed that the loss was worth approximately \$30,000. This case remains under investigation. #250928002

Fraud

On 9/25, a victim reported being scammed out of approximately 2.4 million dollars over the last 18 months. A scammer called claiming that the victim was the subject of a criminal investigation, then connected the victim with two other scammers who claimed to be FBI and IRS agents, respectively. The scammers told the victim his assets were being confiscated and convinced him to move his assets into an external wallet, in the form of cryptocurrency. The scammers assured the victim that the funds were being kept in a safe custody account owned by the FBI. After the victim had depleted his account, he found that there was no investigation, and the phone numbers the scammers had been using were disconnected. This case remains under investigation. #250925028

Grand Theft

On 9/25, a hospital on Paseo Padre Pkwy reported that more than \$116,000 worth of medical equipment was stolen from its campus. This case remains under investigation. #250926027

On 9/29, officers responded to a suspicious circumstance at a hardware store on Ice House Ter. Multiple subjects ran from the store with items, then threw merchandise over a fence. Officers located and detained both subjects nearby, and an asset protection employee from the store confirmed that the items had been stolen. The subjects advised officers that the stolen items were hidden near the store, and an officer recovered approximately \$1,200 worth of merchandise. The subjects were placed under arrest. #250929006

Outside Assist

On 9/24, officers responded to a request for assistance from campus safety at a college on Mission Blvd. A subject had threatened via email to commit a shooting at the school. Campus safety evacuated the school and identified the subject to FPD. Officers drafted a warrant for the subject's arrest, then responded to the subject's residence. The subject was taken into custody without incident and placed under arrest.

Possession of a Controlled Substance

On 9/29, officers responded to a disturbance at an apartment complex on Logan Dr. A subject was walking around the complex with his pants down and appeared to be intoxicated. Upon contact, officers discovered the subject had an outstanding warrant and was in possession of methamphetamine. The subject was placed under arrest. #250929001

Robbery

On 9/26, officers responded to a restraining order violation at an apartment complex on San Pedro Dr. A subject was sitting in his vehicle with his ex-girlfriend (victim). They began to argue, and the subject forcefully took the victim's phone from her. The subject said he would return the phone if the victim left the vehicle, but when she exited, the subject left the scene with the phone. Officers obtained an emergency protective order for the victim and forwarded the case to the Alameda County District Attorney's office.

Sending a False Fire Alarm

On 9/29, officers responded to a disturbance at a hotel on Farwell Pl. A subject had pulled the fire alarm intentionally and appeared to be under the influence. The subject could not explain why he had pulled the fire alarm. The subject was placed under arrest. #250929005

Vandalism

On 9/25, officers responded to a subject threatening employees at a grocery store on Fremont Blvd. The subject had a large rock and was refusing to leave the store. The subject threw the rock through a store window, then fled on a bicycle. Officers located the subject nearby and placed him under arrest.
