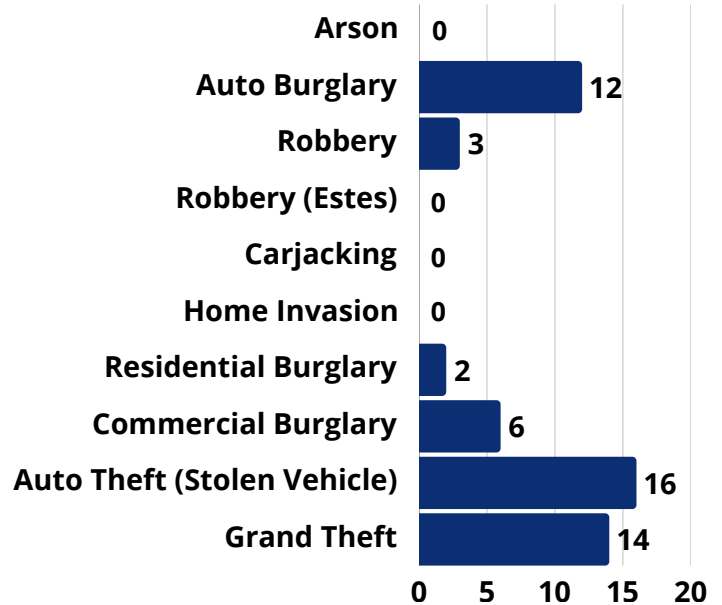




# Fremont Police Week In Review

## Battery

On 2/25, officers responded to a report of battery at a residence on Argonaut Way. The victim was in an argument with his sister (subject) at the residence. The subject threatened to stab the victim, who said he would call the police. The subject threw a set of keys at the victim's head, injuring him. The subject was placed under arrest. #260225019

## Domestic Violence

On 2/27, officers responded to a report of domestic violence at an apartment on Pennsylvania Ave. The victim and her husband (subject) were involved in a verbal altercation, and then the subject used a bike lock to strike the victim in the head. The subject fled on foot and was not located. This case will be forwarded for charging. #260227002

## DUI/Hit-and-Run Collision

On 2/26, officers responded to multiple vehicle collisions. A driver struck another vehicle in a head-on collision at Mowry Ave and Argonaut Way. The subject did not attempt to stop and kept driving. Shortly afterward, the same driver collided with a tree near Blacow Rd and Rogers Ave, which caused the vehicle to overturn. The driver was determined to be intoxicated and was placed under arrest. #260226027 and #260226030

## Fraud

On 2/24, a victim reported being scammed out of several hundred thousand dollars in cryptocurrency. The victim met a subject online, who convinced her to open a cryptocurrency trading account. The victim met in-person with a second subject to provide cash for deposit into the cryptocurrency account. However, when she attempted to withdraw the funds, she was unable. This case remains under investigation. #260224015

On 2/27, a victim reported that she was the target of a phone scam. She met a subject on a messaging app, who convinced her to put money into a membership system. The victim believed she would receive money if she added money into the system. On multiple occasions, the victim wired thousands of dollars to an account provided by the subject, resulting in a loss of hundreds of thousands of dollars. #260227014

## Indecent Exposure

On 3/2, officers responded to a disturbance at an apartment complex on Beacon Ave. A subject locked himself inside the complex's business center and was masturbating. The subject ignored an employee's request for him to leave. The subject was placed under arrest. #260302009

## Possession of Stolen Property

On 2/24, a reporting party observed a suspicious vehicle inside a gated apartment complex on Grimmer Blvd. The vehicle stopped at multiple stalls, and the driver looked into the bed of a utility truck before leaving at high speed. Officers stopped the vehicle at a nearby gas station, where they found multiple spools of copper wire and tools consistent with those used in fuel theft. The vehicle also had stolen packages. The driver was placed under arrest. #260224034

## Robbery

On 2/28, officers responded to a robbery on Fremont Blvd. The victim locked his bicycle outside a store, and when he returned, his taillight was missing. A nearby subject was holding it and refused to return it. When the victim attempted to take a photo, the subject punched him in the face. Officers located and identified the subject the next day, finding him in possession of the bicycle light and methamphetamine. The subject was placed under arrest. #260228015

## Vandalism

On 2/24, officers responded to a report of vandalism at a residence on Mission Blvd. The victim's son (subject) was outside the residence, smashing her vehicle's windshield. The subject fled on foot and was not located. This case will be forwarded for charging. #260224011

On 3/1, officers were conducting patrol checks near Liberty St and Stevenson Blvd when they saw a subject crossing the street in an unsafe matter. The subject was holding two bottles of liquor and appeared to be intoxicated. He was belligerent and kicked a vehicle driving in the area, damaging it. The subject was placed under arrest. #260301028

## Warrant Service

On 3/1, officers responded to a disturbance at a grocery store on Mission Blvd. A subject in the food court was making veiled threats toward patrons and asking if they were human. Upon contact, officers found the subject had an outstanding felony warrant and two outstanding misdemeanor warrants. The subject was placed under arrest. #260301005
