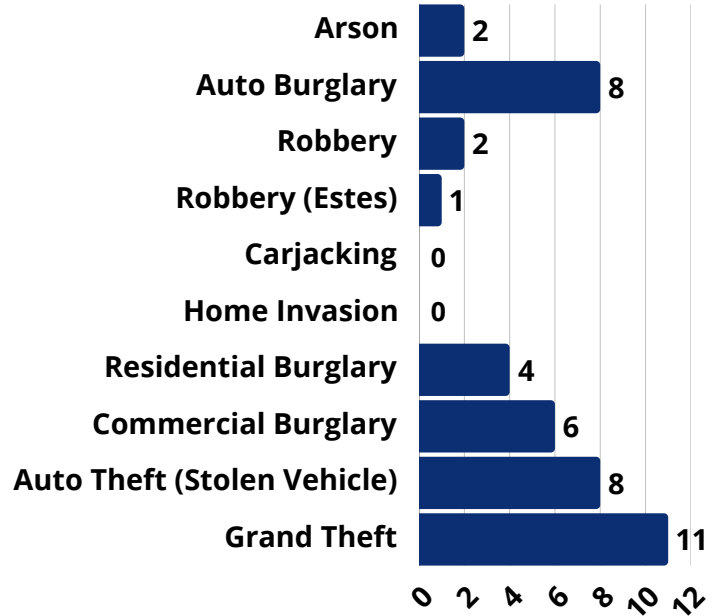

Assault with a Deadly Weapon/Child Endangerment

On 3/16, officers responded to a report of assault with a deadly weapon at an apartment on High St. The victim and subject were conducting a child exchange of their 1-year-old son. After the exchange, while the juvenile was in the subject's vehicle, the subject intentionally rammed the victim's vehicle. The victim drove towards the Fremont Police Department, and the subject rammed the victim three more times. The subject fled before officers arrived, but later agreed to meet in another city. The subject was placed under arrest, and the juvenile was reunited with the victim. #260316009

Auto Burglary

On 3/14, officers responded to an auto burglary at an apartment complex on Guardino Dr. Officers located two subjects actively attempting to break into a vehicle on Litchfield Dr. Prior to the subjects fleeing in a stolen vehicle, officers successfully disabled the tires. The vehicle fled into a neighboring city and collided with a fence line. The vehicle was determined to be unoccupied, but another law enforcement agency located both subjects in the area. The two subjects, both juveniles, were transported to a local hospital for medical clearance. Both subjects were placed under arrest. #260314003

Battery

On 3/12, officers responded to a report of battery at a fast-food restaurant on Decoto Rd. The victim was waiting at the bus stop when a subject approached and punched him in the face. The subject also had an outstanding misdemeanor warrant. The subject walked into the restaurant, where officers responded and placed him under arrest. #260312010

Evading Arrest

On 3/14, midnight officers received notice from a nearby law enforcement agency that a vehicle involved in an armed carjacking was captured on camera on Mission Blvd. Officers located the vehicle at a convenience store on Mission Blvd and Niles Canyon Rd. The vehicle fled, driving through two fences and the playground of an elementary school. This occurred in the early morning hours, when no one was at the school. Officers pursued and successfully stopped the vehicle in another city. The driver was transported for medical treatment, then released to the original law enforcement agency. #260314006

Kidnapping

On 3/10, officers responded to a hospital on Mowry Ave regarding a victim. A subject lured the victim into the back of his vehicle, which had the child lock feature activated. He beat the victim, using a metal bracelet as a weapon. The subject drove the victim to the hospital against his will and told him to make a false police report. The subject was located and placed under arrest. #260310031

Shots Fired/Assault with a Deadly Weapon

On 3/13, officers responded to a suspicious circumstance involving a firearm at an apartment on Foxtail Terrace. The victim said her ex-boyfriend (subject) crawled through her window with a firearm and was threatening to kill her. The day before, the subject used a firearm to threaten her, firing four to five rounds into the asphalt. Officers located the subject seated in his vehicle in the parking lot. The firearm was located behind the vehicle. Live rounds and empty shell casings were found inside the vehicle. There were bullet holes in the ground. The subject was placed under arrest, and officers obtained an Emergency Protective Order on behalf of the victim. #260313001

Stalking

On 3/15, officers responded to a report of stalking at a residence on Darrow Ct. The subject was living in his vehicle, parked near the victims' residence. The subject has been observing the family for several weeks. On one occasion, the subject lifted the victim's young son while the victim was walking with his grandmother. On another occasion, the subject delivered handwritten love notes to the victim's teenage daughter. The subject was placed under arrest. Officers obtained an emergency protective order on behalf of the victim. #260315008

Suspicious Fire

On 3/16, an officer responded to a suspicious fire near a bank on Paseo Padre Parkway. A subject set a shopping cart on fire. The Fremont Fire Department responded to extinguish the fire. The subject was not located. #260316036

Unlawful Fire

On 3/11, officers responded to a request for assistance from the Fremont Fire Department. A subject lit a fire near the railroad tracks at Aspenwood Common and was refusing to extinguish it. The fire posed a hazard due to its proximity to railroad tracks and surrounding vegetation. The subject was also fueling the fire with clothing, wood, and other debris. The subject was found to have multiple outstanding misdemeanor warrants and was placed under arrest. #260311056
