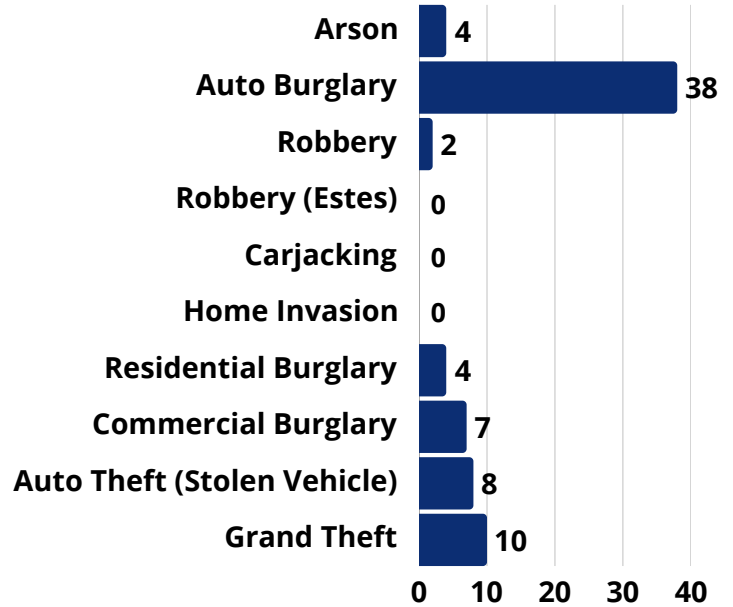

## Arson

On 3/18, the Fremont Fire Department observed a subject starting a fire next to a grocery store on Mowry Ave. The subject lit items on fire and threw them in the irrigation drain system and bushes next to the building. The subject also had a restraining order preventing him from being at the grocery store. The subject was placed under arrest. #260318008

On 3/20, officers responded to assist the Fremont Fire Department with a fire at a temple on Hansen Ave. The Fire Department extinguished the fire before officers arrived, but advised that the fire was possibly suspicious. Nearby residents advised of a second fire in front of an adjacent residence. A stroller was left aflame in the front yard, and the resident extinguished it. The fire appeared to have caused some structural damage to the home. #260320004

On 3/20, officers responded to the wooded area of Brown Rd regarding a subject lighting trees on fire. The Fremont Fire Department was on scene to extinguish the fire, and the subject was located in the parking garage. He was also believed to be involved in a similar fire set the day prior in the same area. The subject was found to have an outstanding felony warrant and was placed under arrest. #260319025 and #260320028

## Auto Burglary

On 3/22, officers responded to an auto burglary on Lindenwood St. Two subjects entered a vehicle by smashing the window. One of the subjects pointed a firearm at the front door. When officers arrived on scene, the subjects were gone, and several vehicles in the area had been burglarized. The same subjects are believed to be responsible for a series of auto burglaries throughout Fremont. In some cases, the subjects used garage door openers in the victim vehicles to enter the garages. In one case, the subjects pointed a firearm at a victim and threatened to kill them. These cases remain under investigation. #260322005

## Commercial Burglary

On 3/22, officers investigated a commercial burglary at a demolition site on Walnut Ave. Multiple subjects entered the secured site and removed copper and other construction materials. Prior calls for service indicated an ongoing pattern of thefts from the location. On 3/24, officers located the subjects' vehicle at a nearby grocery store and conducted a traffic stop. The stolen materials were found in the vehicle, as well as a significant amount of narcotics and items commonly used for drug sales. Two subjects were placed under arrest. A search of one of the subjects' residences revealed additional narcotics, drug paraphernalia, stolen property, a stolen motorcycle, and a firearm with an obliterated serial number. #260322054

## DUI

On 3/19, officers responded to a business on Northport Loop regarding a suspicious vehicle. A vehicle was stopped in the business driveway for approximately 15 minutes. When officers arrived, the vehicle was driving significantly under the speed limit and constantly braking and veering to the right shoulder. The subject was determined to be intoxicated and was placed under arrest. #260319002

## Mental Health Hold

On 3/23, officers responded to a church on Cabrillo Terrace regarding a suspicious person. A subject used a hatchet to smash a vehicle in the parking lot. When officers arrived, the subject was inside the vehicle and continuing to smash it from the inside. The subject was also spraying an unknown substance outside the vehicle. The subject did not respond to multiple commands to exit the vehicle and drop the hatchet. Officers attempted negotiations extensively, but the subject remained in the vehicle. During the investigation, it was discovered that the individual was, in fact, wanted. A police K-9 was ultimately used to subdue the subject after multiple forms of less-lethal devices were ineffective. The subject was placed on a mental health hold and is also subject to the warrants against him. #260323032

## Vandalism

On 3/22, officers responded to a vandalism at a residence on Boggs Ave. A subject broke three vehicle windows and had been throwing rocks at the residence earlier that day. The same subject had been harassing the victims for several days. The subject was placed under arrest. #260322048

## Warrant Service

On 3/18, officers responded to a department store on Fremont Blvd, regarding a suspicious person. A subject followed the reporting party to her vehicle and attempted to open the rear door. The reporting party drove away, and the subject was located at a nearby bus stop. The subject was found to have an outstanding warrant and was placed under arrest. #260318018
