

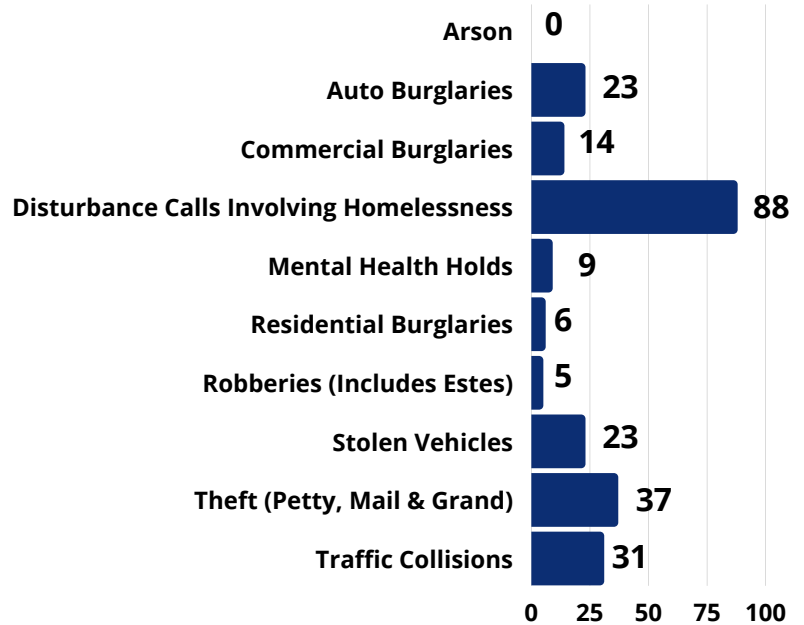


Fremont Police Week In Review

False ID/Warrant Arrest

On 7/25, officers initiated a traffic stop on Alvarado Blvd near Highway 880. The driver of the vehicle provided false identification to conceal his identity and his multiple warrants. Officers recognized the vehicle from a recent hit and run collision that was being investigated. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested. #220725034

Felony Warrant Arrest

On 7/24, officers responded to a call from a remote security monitoring company regarding subjects seen walking within the gated area of an auto auction company parking lot. Officers arrived and spotted a suspicious vehicle leaving the area. A traffic stop was initiated and the driver was found to have two felony warrants. One adult suspect out of Newark was arrested. #220724008

On 7/24, officers responded to call of a theft suspect who fought with security and fled a discount department store on Osgood Dr. Officers arrived on scene and saw the suspect fleeing to the rear of the store. The suspect climbed onto the BART tracks and ran into a commercial area on Old Warm Springs Blvd. Officers kept a visual on the suspect from a safe distance and directed responding officers to the area the suspect was last seen. One adult suspect out of Oxnard was arrested. Investigation reveals the suspect was also wanted on a felony no-bail robbery warrant. # 220724009

Robbery

On 7/19, officers responded to a robbery near Deep Creek Rd and Crandallwood Dr. The victim was walking with two children when two suspects approached the victim and demanded the victim's jewelry. One of the suspects displayed a handgun as the second suspect ripped a necklace from the victim's neck. The two suspects appeared to be juveniles and were last seen running on Deep Creek Rd towards Paseo Padre Pkwy. Officers arrived on scene but were unable to locate the suspects. The case remains under active investigation. #220719015



Fremont Police Week In Review

On 7/20, officers responded to a mail carrier (victim) being robbed near Dusterberry Way and Hansen Ave. The suspect pushed the victim several times and demanded a mail key. The victim provided the key and the suspect fled in a passenger vehicle. Officers were able to locate and stop the vehicle, and found three suspects inside the vehicle. Three adult suspects out of Fremont were arrested. The vehicle contains unrelated stolen property and investigation reveals these suspects are involved in robberies in nearby cities. #220720024

On 7/20, officers responded to a grocery store where an employee saw a suspect filling a backpack with liquor. When the employee approached the suspect, the suspect started yelling and claimed that he had a gun and a knife. The suspect then left the store. Officers responded and detained a suspect based on the description provided by the employee. An in-field lineup was conducted and the suspect was positively identified. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested. #220720003

Vandalism

On 7/22, officers responded to a reporting party (victim) being battered by a significant other (suspect) in a hotel parking lot. As officers were en-route, the suspect located the victim's vehicle and vandalized it. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested. #220722005

On 7/22, officers responded to a retirement home on Fremont Blvd near Thornton Ave for a report of a suspect causing a disturbance and damaging property. The suspect was intoxicated and breaking several exterior lights at the facility with a metal pipe. When officers arrived, they observed the suspect standing in the middle of the road. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested. #220723007
