

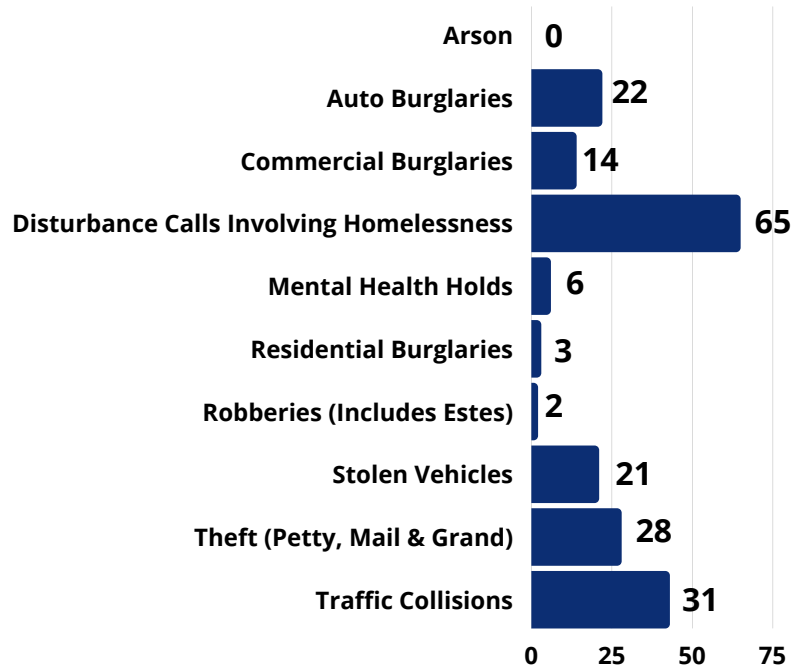


# Fremont Police Week In Review

### Assault

On 11/12, officers responded to a restaurant on Mowry Ave to a report of a suspect threatening staff with a knife. As officers were enroute, all employees had evacuated the building and the suspect remained inside and was believed to be attempting to start a fire. Officers arrived and quickly detained the suspect. Fremont Fire also arrived and determined there was no evidence of a fire. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested. This case remains under investigation. #221112010

On 11/13, officers responded to an assault with a deadly weapon at a motel in North Fremont. The incident began in a Newark hotel where the suspect battered the victim. The victim then drove to a motel in North Fremont where he was pistol whipped by the suspect in the lobby. The suspect left and fled in a vehicle. Officers located the suspect vehicle and detained two occupants. One of the occupants, an adult from Brooklyn, NY, was positively identified as the suspect and was arrested. #221113013

### Battery

On 11/11, officers responded to a battery at a residence on Paseo Padre Pkwy near Parkmont Dr. The battery took place between a dating couple who were very intoxicated. The victim sustained a significant laceration injury due to suspect throwing a glass candle. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested. #221111024

### DUI

On 11/9, a non-injury traffic collision occurred at Fremont Blvd and Thornton Ave. One of the parties (suspect) refused to exchange information and drove away. The other party followed behind and called 911. Officers responded and located the suspect. Upon investigation, it was determined that the suspect was driving under the influence. One adult suspect out of Hayward was arrested. #221109028

## Gun Shots Fired

On 11/13, officers responded to Dondero Way to multiple reports of gunshots being heard. One reporting party advised shots were possibly being fired into the air. Officers quickly arrived on scene and located an unoccupied vehicle which was believed to be associated to the shooter. Several shell casings were found in roadway; however, no bullet impacts were found on the vehicles or houses nearby, and no injuries were reported. Witnesses also provided officers information on two additional suspect vehicles. Shortly after, Newark Police Department (NPD) reported a similar incident involving one of the suspect vehicles. NPD located the suspect vehicle and arrested a suspect. #221113015

## Other Arrests

On 11/8, officers responded to a fast-food restaurant at Gateway Plaza to a report of a subject actively accosting customers. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested. #221108015

On 11/11, officers responded to a grocery store on Hackamore Ln to a report of a subject causing a disturbance. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested. #221111013

On 11/11, officers responded to a report of strange phone calls being received at a motel in North Fremont. While on scene, officers contacted a subject who was on probation and had an arrest warrant. One adult suspect out of Gilroy was arrested. #221111020

On 11/14, officers responded to Nightingale Tr for a suspicious person who had been trying to open doors to residences and vehicles. Officers located the suspect and found the suspect was in possession of burglary tools. One adult suspect out of Union City was arrested. #221114008
