

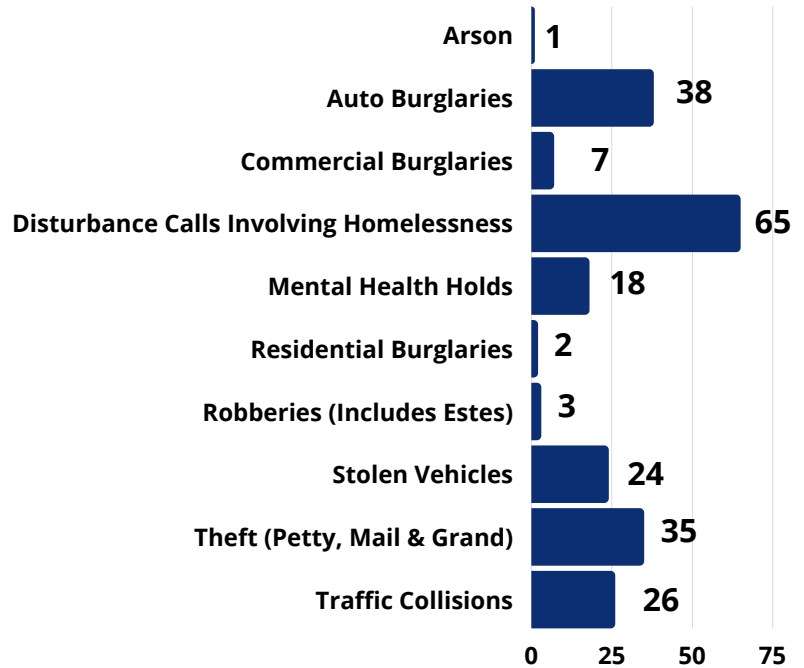

Ascertain the Program

On 11/18, officers responded to a call on Armour Ct after the reporting party advised that she heard two gunshots after her husband walked out of their residence holding a handgun. While en route, the reporting party advised that her husband was back inside the home with the firearm. Officers arrived on scene and detained the subject without incident. Officers searched the area and found two shell casings but no bullet impacts or victims. Ultimately, the subject was placed on a mental health hold, and the firearm used in the incident was seized. #221118002

Civil Standby

On 11/16, officers were dispatched to assist with a civil standby regarding an eviction notice. The tenant has been the subject of recent calls for service, which include brandishing a firearm at other residents to vandalizing another tenant's vehicle. Based on the circumstances, a Mobile Evaluation Team (MET) officer also responded to help coordinate alternative resources and services for the tenant. #221116016

Domestic Disturbance

On 11/18, officers responded to a domestic disturbance on Mission Rd. The suspect had assaulted his spouse and refused to come out of the residence. The suspect eventually came out of the house after officers negotiated with him for a short time. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested. #221118046

Shoplifting/Retail Theft

On 11/16, officers responded to a store at the Fremont Hub regarding a suspect loading merchandise into a duffel bag. Store security was familiar with the suspect based on several prior incidents of similar activity. Officers arrived and coordinated with security while the suspect exited the store with the stolen merchandise. One adult suspect out of Richmond was arrested. #221116026

Stolen Vehicle

On 11/17, officers were dispatched to a report of a stolen vehicle from a rental car company. The suspect, who failed to return a rental vehicle, was identified, and the vehicle information was promptly entered into the stolen vehicle system. A few hours later, a license plate reader in Newark picked up the stolen vehicle traveling eastbound on Thornton Blvd into Fremont. Officers searched the area and located the vehicle in a restaurant parking lot. Officers observed the suspect exiting the vehicle, and he was detained without incident. A warrant check revealed that the suspect was wanted for several additional crimes. Officers recovered the stolen vehicle, and one adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested. #221117021

Other Arrests

On 11/15, officers responded to a convenience store on Sundale Ave for a report of a person panhandling and refusing to leave after being asked by the store owner. Officers contacted the person (suspect), and a warrant check revealed that the suspect had several outstanding warrants. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested. #221115006

On 11/18, officers conducted a security check in a parking lot near Grimmer and Fremont Blvd. Officers encountered a suspect possessing burglary tools and a stolen motorcycle license plate. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested. #221119001

On 11/20, officers conducted a traffic stop near Argonaut Way and Mowry Ave. One of the occupants was on probation, and a probation search yielded several ounces of illegal substances inside the occupant's purse. One adult suspect out of Union City was arrested. #221120004
