

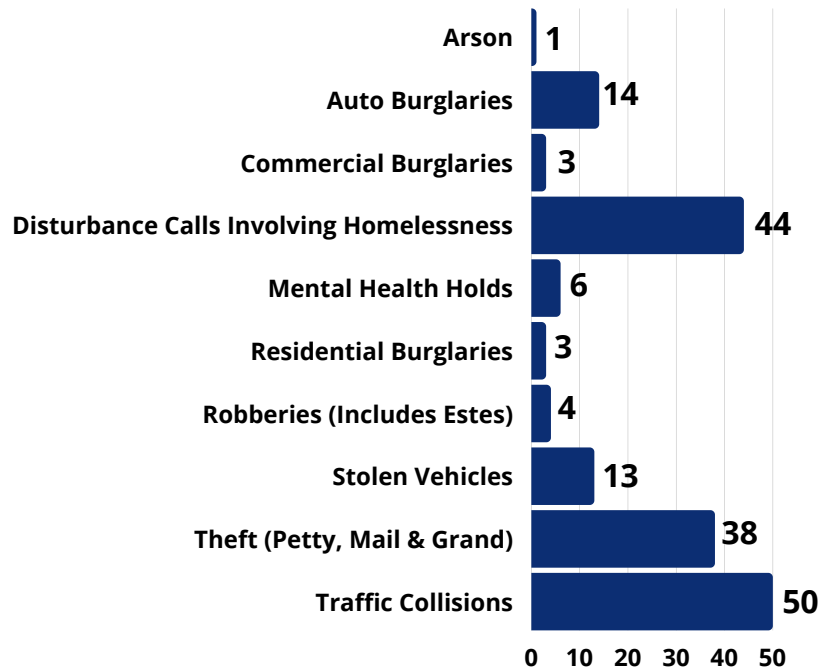


Fremont Police Week In Review

Auto Burglary

On 11/29, officers responded to Harvey Park after a victim of an auto burglary in Union City tracked his stolen cell phone to the area. The victim observed four juveniles walking in the area and looking into parked vehicles. Officers initially checked the area but were unable to locate them. A short time later, the victim received updated pings in the area of Peregrine Way and Falcon Drive and observed the same subjects sitting at the park. Officers arrived and contacted the four juveniles. The juveniles had the stolen cell phone, and Union City Police Department responded to take over the investigation of the initial auto burglary. While in the area, Fremont Police officers noted a parked vehicle near the location of the detention, and the ignition was punched. They contacted the registered vehicle owner and determined this was an unreported stolen vehicle. Based on the location and time frame, the four juveniles were believed to be responsible for this crime. #221129036, #221130003

On 11/30, Fremont Police was notified about a neighboring agency investigating an auto burglary. The loss (a laptop bag) was equipped with a tracking device, revealing its location around Albrae Ave in Fremont. Officers responded to the area and observed a similarly described suspect vehicle and a subject milling about the vehicle. Upon seeing the officers, the suspect quickly walked away, and a short foot pursuit was initiated. Officers were able to catch up and arrest the suspect, who was determined to have several outstanding felonious warrants. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested. #221130012

Robbery

On 11/30, a reporting party called dispatch to report that six to nine subjects were in a convenience store on Mowry Ave, committing a robbery. As units responded to the scene, the convenience clerk called dispatch and confirmed he was robbed by multiple suspects who had fled on foot. Suspects were all described as wearing ski masks and hoodies and fled in a dark-colored SUV. No weapons were used during the crime. A few minutes later, while Fremont Police units were investigating the case, officers from a nearby city were dispatched to an active robbery at a convenience store in their city. The suspect descriptions, loss, and vehicle matched the suspects in this investigation. 221201001

Stolen Vehicle/Carjacking

On 12/3, officers were dispatched to the Inspiration Way and Wisdom Road area for a stolen vehicle report. When officers arrived, they learned the stolen vehicle had tracking capabilities. During the initial interview with the victim, the victim disclosed that the suspect had forcibly pushed him to the ground and taken the vehicle. The investigation was upgraded to a carjacking. The victim stated that two suspects were wearing black hoodies. As the investigation continued, officers were able to locate the vehicle using information from the vehicle's tracking capabilities as well as license plate readers in the area. Officers found the car unoccupied and spotted an individual with outstanding warrants nearby. An infield line-up was done with the victim, who could not identify the individual as the suspect who took the vehicle. An area search, including the use of a drone, was conducted, and a second suspect was not located. The individual was arrested for outstanding warrants, and the investigation is ongoing. #221204001

Other Arrests

On 11/29, officers were dispatched to a report of a subject passed out in a vehicle at Walnut Ave and Paseo Padre Pkwy. Officers located the vehicle and contacted the driver, who was determined to be driving under the influence. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested. #221129023

On 12/4, officers were alerted to a stolen vehicle driving southbound on Fremont Blvd. Officers located the stolen vehicle and observed the driver (only occupant) exit the vehicle. One adult suspect out of Milpitas was arrested. #221204014

On 12/5, officers conducted a security check at a Church in Irvington due to a reporting party hearing screaming in the area. Officers located a subject in the area with a felony warrant. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested. #221205010
